A few short years ago, social media forums whipped up a frenzy to the tune of A Sqn 10 Light Horse being struck from Army's Order of Battle. Thankfully that never became a reality, but it shows how far we have come in 2021, to be re-raising the famous Regiment to full unit status. Backing up this historic occasion is commitment from Army to provide the unit with a new platform, the Hawkei Protected Mobility Vehicle, now in the unit's possession. With these vehicles on display, the 10th Light Horse will stand re-raised on the 107th anniversary of the Regiment's inception, the 10th of October 2021. The significance of this occasion, and indeed the Regiment's enduring place in the Army's Order of Battle, is not lost on the unit's members and community. With new platforms comes an expanded role, with 10LH being given increasing tasks and responsibilities in the Intelligence, Reconnaissance and Surveillance space.

By January 2022 the Regiment will be manned with a Regimental Headquarters, and 2 Squadrons both containing 2 Troops. The Regiment aspires to recruit an additional troop per year for the next 2 years, and we are well supported by Defence Force Recruiting and the 13th Brigade in doing so. We have runs on the board with this, recruiting a full troop in the last 12 months since the announcement of B Squadron's establishment and the release of a fourth troop.

In 2022 the Regiment will enter the new era trialling new tactics, systems and of course, exploring the capabilities of the Hawkei. It will be a busy yet exciting year for the unit, with major exercises planned in the far reaches of WA in order to prove our capabilities in the extremities of our Area of Operations. In addition to this, we will be maintaining our directed tasks as a force element in support of domestic operations over the high risk weather season, and other contingencies. COVID 19 continues to challenge us, with many of our soldiers heading to the eastern states for technical, trade and promotion courses. Unfortunately this disruption is likely to continue into 2022. I have been amazed at the commitment and dedication shown by our soldiers in the past 2 years. Not only have they maintained commitment to getting qualified, often necessitating a several week course back up by 2 weeks' isolation, they have consistently volunteered for various domestic support tasks. It is true that good things happen to good people, and I remain convinced that the reason the Regiment was chosen for re-raising and new capability, is ultimately down to the consistent high performance of its soldiers and NCOs.

The Regimental parade on the 10th of October is a must attend for anyone affiliated with the Royal Australian Armoured Corps in WA. Our planning team, exceptionally led by the RSM, are putting together an event that will be a fantastic spectacle and deserving of the unit. I look forward to seeing the RAAC family

there.
